The Newest Holiday



They would only care about being nice.

King was born on January 15, 1929. He was born in Georgia. When King was born, people were not treated the same. They did not have

equal rights. Georgia had laws. The laws did not give people equal rights. Other states had these laws, too.

The laws said what some people who looked different than some others could not do. Black people could not live with white people. They could not go to the same schools. They could not eat in the same restaurants. They could not use the same bathrooms. They could not drink from the same water fountains or swim in the same pools.



King knew this was wrong. He knew people were the same. They all had blood of the same color. King wanted the laws to change. King fought hard. He fought for peace. He fought in a peaceful way. He did not hit. He did not yell. He sat. He marched. People of all colors joined him. They sat and marched together.

King and all the people helped change the laws. New laws were made. The laws gave people equal rights. One new law was made in 1983. This law made a new holiday! It made Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. The holiday is in January. It is on the third Monday. It is a day to remember King's dream.
