The Stars and Stripes




The United States needed a flag. It needed a flag when it became a new country. Its flag was three colors. It was red. It was white. It was blue. The flag had stripes. It had 13 stripes. The stripes were two colors. They were red and white. The top stripe was red. The next stripe was white. The flag had stars. It had 13 stars. The stars were one color. They were white. They were on a blue field.

There were 13 colonies. The colonies joined together. They joined together to make a new country. The colonies became states. The 13 stripes stood for the 13 colonies. The 13 stars stood for the 13 colonies.

But the new country got bigger. More states were added. New states joined together with the old states. In 1775, there were 15 states. The flag had 15 stars. It had 15 stripes. Each state had a star. Each state had a stripe. More states were added. By 1817, there were 20 states! The flag had 20 stars. It had 20 stripes!

There were too many stripes. The flag was looking too messy. In 1818, a new law was passed. The law said that the flag would have only 13 stripes. But the flag would have more stars. There would be a star for every state. It would have a white star in a field of blue. The last star was added in 1959. Today our flag has 50 stars. It has one star for each of its 50 states.

There are flag rules. One rule is about how to raise it. The flag should be raised swiftly. One rule is about how to lower it. The flag should not be lowered swiftly. It should be lowered slowly.
