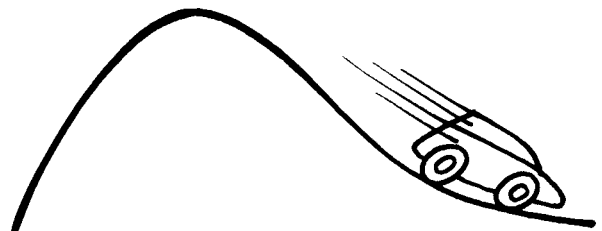
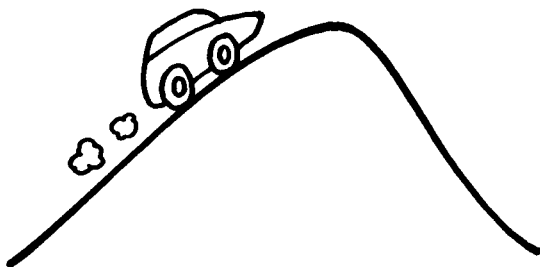
World's Longest Sentences
